Extended Project Qualification (AQA)

- The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a single piece of work, of a student's choosing that requires evidence of planning, preparation, research and independent learning. An Extended Project can be:
- a) 5,000 word research report
- b) a creation/artefact with a shorter written research report of 1,000 words

The EPQ is based on something that you decide it to be on. Therefore you should undertake the EPQ based on a topic that you have a genuine interest and curiosity about.

It is an independent topic and you are expected to spend c.90hours on this project.

- The EPQ should complement your other A level subjects but cannot be based on an area of specification that you are studying in your A levels
- Transferable skills: independent research, critical thinking, verbal and written communication skills and innovation Many universities value the EPQ highly and include it in their UCAS offers
- Counts as half an A-Level and UCAS points
